## **Hazardous Weather – Tropical Cyclones**

Weather is an important factor that influences aircraft performance and flying safety. As you may already know, the Atlantic hurricane season is from June 1<sup>st</sup> through November 30<sup>th</sup>. This is the period of the year when tropical or subtropical cyclones are most likely to form. The NOAA National Weather Service forecasters predict above-average hurricane activity in the Atlantic basin for 2024. Hurricanes are among nature's most powerful and destructive phenomena. The primary hazards from tropical cyclones are storm surge flooding, inland flooding from heavy rains, destructive winds, tornadoes, and high surf or rip currents. It is important for pilots and residents to prepare an evacuation plan and prepare properly for these potentially life-threatening storms.





If there is a tropical storm or hurricane forecasted to impact Indian River County or the surrounding areas, the Cherokee Flyers Operations Team will put a maintenance reservation block on the aircraft and work with flight line or service center to store the aircraft in a hangar. During this time club airplanes will not be available for rent or instruction flights.
